Super finals – elimination/points race (Pro)

Team relay – 3 members (Pro, Amateur and Young)

Track

In Eesti Maaülikooli sports facility on an area of three basketball fields. The track is 100m long, at least 4m wide and covered with Mondo Elastisport flooring which assures a great grip in corners.

Results

The single distance winners will be declared based on preliminary races and finals. All the distances except Team relay give points which will be used to declare the overall winners. The winner will be the skater with least points. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place = 0 points; 2nd place = 2 points; 3rd place = 3 points etc.

Award ceremony

In Pro class three best men and women on every distance will be awarded with a diploma, in overall ranking with a diploma, a trophy and a prize. In Amateur and Young classes three best men and women on every distance will be awarded with a diploma, in overall ranking with a diploma and a prize.

Miscellaneous

Participants are required to wear a helmet and participant's number during the competition. Failing to do so might result in disqualification. It is allowed to take part only on inline or quad roller skates.
